

Sir:

I have the honor to acknowledge receipt of Departmental letter No. 156-0-5, dated January 20th, instant, in regard to the accountable cheque sent to Mr. Acting Indian Agent E.G. Newnham of Kwawkewlth Agency, B.C., wherewith to meet the cost of labor in connection with certain improvements and repairs in course of execution there, all labor being under the direction of the Acting Agent in concert with the school principal, Mr. Anfield.

In reply I beg to advise the Department that the hardware and cement were purchased on tender through this office and accounts will reach the Department through the office of the Acting Agent who has been instructed in regard thereto. The lumber is being purchased by Mr. Newnham at Alert Bay, as it can be obtained more cheaply and with better facility at that point, also at a saving of freight charges which would necessarily attend purchase at Vancouver.

It is hoped that it will be possible to have the work as authorized completed before the end of the fiscal year. A question concerning the erection of galvanized, instead of brick, chimneys has been referred by the Agent to the Department upon instructions from this office. I did not care to authorize any change in work which had been considered by the Department on the recommendation of a building inspector and on plans calculated to bring the work into accord with the main construction, without having the matter submitted to the Department for its consideration and instructions. There may be a little delay on this account. If for any reason of unavoidable delay it is not possible to complete the erection of the chimneys before the end of March next, I hope it will be possible for the Department to either avoid the lapse of the appropriation or renew it in the new fiscal year. Every effort will be made to see that the work is expedited.





Sir:

I have your letter of the 28th ultimo, regarding the removing of the old sawmill buildings from the school site at Alert Bay and informing the Department that, in order to complete this work, it will be necessary to employ ten Indians for a further six days at relief rates and that the sum of \$120 in excess of the amount already authorized will be required for the purpose.

The Department is anxious that the work in demolishing the old sawmill buildings and having the site cleaned up be completed as soon as possible and that all good material be disposed of, partly to the Residential School and local Anglican Church and the balance to deserving Indians who may wish to obtain same. All the other unusable debris should be burned and the site left in a clean condition. If possible, this work should be completed and accounts covering the entire cost forwarded in time for payment before our books close at the end of the present fiscal year, viz., March 31st, next.

Accounts already received from you towards the cost of the removal of the sawmill buildings are as follows:

Besides, there are accounts for the fare of Mr. Dodson from Vancouver to Alert Bay and return, to a total amount of \$23.00. Mr. Commissioner Perry, in a letter to the Department dated October 18th, last, stated as follows: "I would judge that the sum of \$500 would be an absolutely outside figure in demolishing the buildings and removing the debris from the site".

Regarding the chimneys referred to in your letter of the 21st instant, I have to say that on the 3rd instant you were forwarded a telegram, as follows:

"May arrange for raising chimneys Alert Bay School, using galvanized iron".

Sir:-

In reply to your letter dated January 20 re the above, I beg to state that with reference to your first paragraph that an accountable cheque for \$250.00 has not yet come to hand, but no doubt it will be received here by the next mail.

With reference to the second paragraph of your letter, in which you state that labour returns in triplicate should be kept, I would state that these are being made out in accordance with your instructions and are being forwarded to the Assistant Commissioner in Victoria as instructed.

The work on the demolition of sawmill buildings in accordance with the Department's agreement with the Columbia Anglican Synod or Diocese is not completed, but has been stopped owing to the appropriation for labour of \$500.00 having been slightly exceeded. This was referred to in my letter to you dated January 21, and also in my letter to the Assistant Commissioner of January 24th.

Other work provided for was the raising of three chimneys, not two, at the Alert Bay Residential School to an additional height of fifteen feet each. This is held in abeyance owing to the Principal raising the question of safety. This is referred to in my letter to you of January 21 in which I requested that plans of the Residential School at Lytton if possible might be forwarded as similar work was undertaken there some years ago, also that the Department architect might be asked for his opinion on the matter as there are so many phases to be considered.

In regard to the building of a wooden arcade connecting the main school building and the classroom block, material for this has been ordered and is being delivered here and handed over to the Principal immediately after inspection. Every effort will be made to have this completed before the end of the fiscal year.

To complete the work of demolishing the sawmill buildings it will be necessary to employ ten Indians for a further six days at relief rates. For this work there is no white foreman needed, as a reliable Indian can take charge of it. This would consist mostly of tearing down the platform and moving piles which still stand and clearing up the land generally.

The quickest method of raising the three chimneys at the Residential School would be to use the metal jack method as recommended by Mr. Anfield. However only one estimate can be received for this locally, and I think the figure quoted, \$300.00, is somewhat excessive. To use brick, three ply, with all the necessary safeguards, would cost more than the balance of the appropriation which has been granted for this, namely \$312.00 from the original appropriation for this phase of the work, i.e., \$425.00. Payment has been made to the foreman-carpenter at the rate of \$6.00 per day for fifteen days and his transportation from Vancouver and return has been paid; this amounted to \$113.00.

Kindly inform me if authority can be given to complete the demolition of the Sawmill for which a further sum of \$120.00 would be required.


