Sir:

I beg to report that I visited the Touchwood Agency during the past month. On May 17th I held a meeting of the Gordon Band for the purpose of negotiating with them for lands for the use of the Gordon Residential School. This question has been pending since the new school was erected in 1921. I obtained an unanimous consent of the majority of the voting members of the band and they surrendered 720 acres for school purposes.

The Committee of the Privy Council have had before them a report, dated 31st May, 1933, from the Superintendent General of Indian Affairs, submitting surrender, together with voters' lists and affidavits, given on the 17th day of May, 1933, by the Gordon's Band of Indians, in the Touchwood Indian Agency, in the Province of Saskatchewan, of parcels of land containing by admeasurement seven hundred and twenty acres, more or less, more particularly described as follows:-

The North-East quarter of Section Two, the South-East quarter of Section Ten, the South half of Section Eleven, and eighty acres being the South-Half of the North-West quarter of Section Eleven, all being in Township Twenty-seven, Range Seventeen, West of the Second Principal Meridian.

The said surrender has been given by the said band in order that the said lands may be made available for the use of the Gordon's Indian Residential School, subject to the conditions contained therein.

The Minister recommends, as the said surrender has been duly authorized, executed and attested in the manner required by the 51st Section of the Indian Act, that it be accepted by Your Excellency in Council.

The Committee concur in the foregoing recommendation and submit the same for approval.

Sir:-

Referring to my letter of the 22nd of May last, with which I forwarded surrenders of land for school purposes on the Gordon's Indian Reserve in the Touchwood Agency, I would be glad to know if these surrenders have been approved. I may inform you that I have had a visit from the Venerable Archdeacon Knowles who requests permission to erect a residence for their resident clergyman on the Reserve on the S.E.  $\frac{1}{4}$  of Sec. 10 which is included in the surrender, and they do not wish to incur any expense until assured that the surrender has been approved. It is important that they should know at the earliest possible date in order that they may complete their building operations before the winter sets in.



Sir:-

I beg to acknowledge receipt of Department letter No. 121-1-9, dated the 26th ultimo, and note that His Excellency the Governor General in Council has approved of the surrender given by the Gordon's Band on the 17th of May last. I have advised the Venerable Archdeacon Knowles to that effect.

I may advise the Department that it will be necessary to have George Pratt, a member of the Band who is residing on this land, remove his buildings at once as the Church Authorities desire the location he has his buildings on for the purpose of erecting a residence for their resident clergyman. I have taken the matter up with Agent Waddy who informs me that this will entail an expenditure of \$100.00. This agrees with the estimate I made when on the ground last spring and which I mentioned in my letter to you dated May 22nd last. I would be glad if a cheque for \$100.00 could be forwarded to the Indian Agent to enable him to have Pratt remove his buildings at the earliest possible date.
