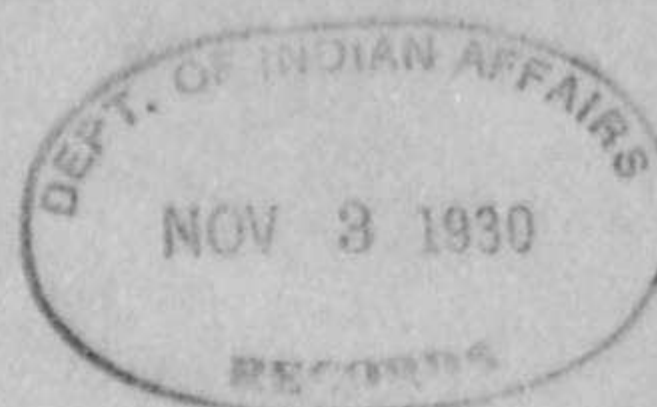

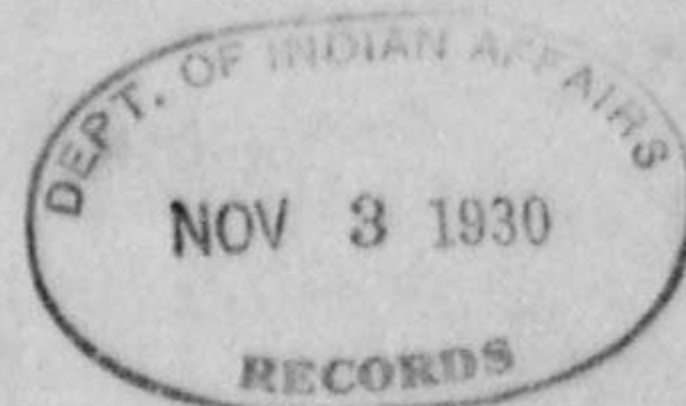

EXTRACT FROM DR. STONE'S REPORT

on

KOOTENAY RESIDENTIAL SCHOOL

CATTLE:

The old herd is worthless and will be eaten during the coming winter. Eight new cows are on their way to the school, approved by the Veterinary Surgeon, and mostly expected to freshen between now and the new year. There will be a good milch supply this winter. The school has sufficient feed. I warned the Agent to have the barn and old herd inspected before putting the new ones in and saw the V. S., who undertook to do it and to direct any measures necessary to prevent possible contamination of the new cows. The stable will probably have to be disinfected and whitewashed. The stockman looks good and the Principal is interested. I do not look for any difficulty along this line.

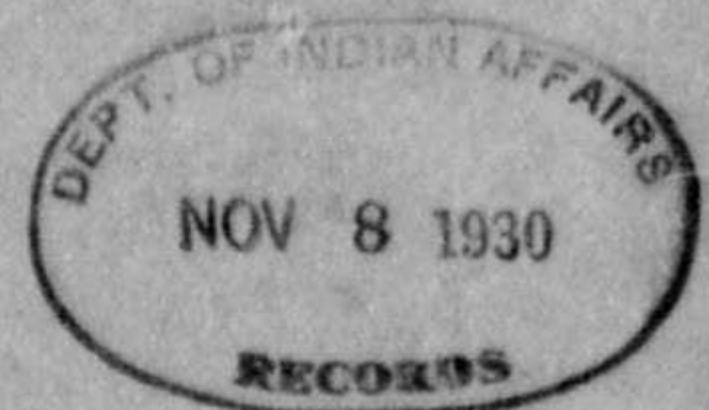

Dear Sir:

As requested by you, and also being directed by Doctor E. L. Stone when in Cranbrook, I visited the Kootenay Indian Residential School on October 30th and again on November 2nd, to apply the Tuberculin Test to the herd of twenty-eight cows at that place. I am pleased to say that the test showed the herd to be free from tuberculosis, there being no reactors.

I also examined the barn and premises, and would recommend a few alterations. I have suggested that the yard be cleaned up and the manure drawn away.


The barn, which was painted inside a number of years ago, should be repainted, as it would be much better than to apply whitewash. Also, there are some alterations that are necessary in the barn, as they are short of stall room for the cows. There are six box stalls situated at one end of the barn where pigs and young calves are now being kept. I would suggest that these be removed and cow stalls put in their place. This would be more satisfactory as it is most unsanitary to keep pigs in a cow barn. I would also suggest that if pigs are to be kept a piggery should be built that would be suitable for the purpose.

The fencing around the barn is in bad shape; the posts are rotten and the wire is down.

I am pleased to say that the live stock at the School farm is in very fine condition, the pigs, poultry and cattle are thrifty and in good health, and the new cows add considerably to the appearance of the herd.
