



Last August it was decided to change the heating unit from hot air to hot water at the above mentioned school. At the time the work commenced, there were on hand at Shubenacadie radiators, valves, pipes, etc., which had been salvaged from the Mt. Pleasant Airport Hospital which had been previously turned over to the Indian Affairs Branch. It was also expected that our caretaker at Shubenacadie could do a considerable amount of the work.

However, as the season was advancing and the work was proceeding very slowly, Indian Superintendent Rice made arrangements with Mr. J.D. Barrett, Truro, Nova Scotia, to take over the work in order to have it completed before the cold weather set in. It was also found when the work was actually started that a considerable amount of additional material was required. This was also supplied by Mr. Barrett. When the work was completed, the Indian Superintendent submitted three Vouchers issued in favour of Mr. Barrett, which were as follows:

The amounts mentioned above were much higher than the Departmental officials expected, and we had the newly installed system inspected. We learned that the system which had been in use during most of the past winter, had proved satisfactory. It was also ascertained that the cost was increased due to the fact that certain changes were requested in the installation by an officer of the engineering services of the Lands & Development Services Branch. It appears that the contractor had been prepared to install the radiators at or near the ceiling on the ground floor, but the engineer from the Lands & Development Services Branch insisted on having the radiators placed on the floor, which necessitated considerable additional work.

We also ascertained that it was necessary, in order to complete the work, to transport labourers from Truro to Shubenacadie, which required three-quarters of an hour each way as well as transportation charges. This, of course, also increased the cost of installation.

The prices shown on the Invoices received from Mr. Barrett appear to be fair and reasonable. We would, therefore, appreciate it if you would approve payment of the accounts which have been submitted by Mr. Barrett, in an amount of \$2,462.01. He is urging immediate payment as the work has been completed for some time, but submission of the matter to you has been delayed until our officials had made a thorough investigation and decided that the expenditure was reasonable for the amount of work performed.







MEMORANDUM:DEPUTY MINISTER.

Re: Change-over of heating system, Shubenacadie
four-room Indian day school, from hot air to
hot water.

You returned departmental memorandum of June 11th with a notation to the effect that you wished to know who authorized this change and also asked if it was approved by the Minister or Deputy Minister. Since the memorandum was returned, I have consulted the Superintendent of Education and also Mr. Morris, who was the Acting Regional Supervisor for the Maritime Provinces at the time this change-over was made. Mr. Morris has prepared a memorandum under date of July 4th, which you will find on file immediately hereunder.

Apparently the question of getting authority was not thought of at the time, as it was felt that when the purchase order was issued for the purchase of a hot water boiler this approved the principle of the change-over. You will note from Mr. Morris' memorandum that the hot air system was entirely inadequate to heat the school, and particularly the two basement rooms, in the proper manner. Although the change-over cost a considerable amount of money, the total cost of this school is still only a little more than half the cost of a similar building at Eskasoni.

Mr. Barrett, who did the heating and plumbing work, has forwarded a further telegram to the Branch indicating that the non-payment of his account is jeopardising his credit with his suppliers. While we realize that authority should have been obtained from Head Office prior to authority having been given for the work, I would recommend that approval be now given, in order that we may pay Mr. Barrett's account. As set out in memorandum of June 11th, it is felt that the expenditure was reasonable for the work performed.

Memorandum:

Acting Director.Re: Installation of hot water heating unit -
Shubenacadie 4-room day school.

The following is a brief explanation for the necessity of installing the hot water heating system in the above mentioned school.

The Shubenacadie 4-room school was constructed at a very low cost of approximately \$20,000. A hot air heating unit was installed - 1st to keep the cost down and 2nd electricity or water was not then available. The hot air heating unit proved that it was unable to heat the building adequately, in fact, it was never possible at any time to heat the two basement rooms, which were to be used for Manual Training and Domestic Science. I held several meetings with the Indians in the basement during the winter of 1948 and despite the fact that all the heating was turned on in the basement rooms, we had to conduct the meetings with overcoats and mufflers on.

When we were dismantling the hospital at Mount Pleasant Airport, at Prince Edward Island, we had a surplus quantity of radiators, pipes, elbows, tees, and valves. I pointed this fact out to the officers of the School Division and suggested that consideration should be given to installing a hot water heating system using these materials, which would substantially reduce the cost. At the time it was considered that Mr. George Johnston, the caretaker, would be able to do the work himself in his spare time without additional cost for the labour. This did not work out for the reason that when Mr. Johnston went over the blueprints he stated when asked that he was unable to do the work properly. It was discovered during the summer of 1948 that the fire pot in the hot air furnace was burnt out and could not be used again during the winter of 1948-1949, as it would be a fire hazard. With Mr. Johnston unable to carry out the work, Superintendent Rice was instructed to investigate the possibilities of securing the services of a competent furnace man, or steam fitter who, with Mr. Johnston's assistance, would install the new heating unit. In the meantime, a hot water heating boiler was purchased, Order #33788.

Mr. Rice was unable to fulfil my request and as it was getting late in the season, it was imperative that something would have to be done. He sent in a quotation from Mr. J. D. Barrett, which we considered was too high. He was again asked to further investigate the possibility of securing a lower tender, but was unable to do so for the reason that it was very difficult for a contractor to make an estimate of the cost of a job of this kind keeping in mind that he had to use second-hand material and supply new material where required. After checking over the job, it was discovered that an extra quantity of radiators were required; Purchase Order #35739, dated November 10, 1948, was placed with Mr. Barrett for them.



This extra radiation was required to meet the specifications of the plans, as set out by the Engineering Division for the Eskasoni School, which are identical to the Shubenacadie 4-room school.

It is my personal opinion that this building could have been adequately heated with less radiation than was shown on the blueprints for the reason that Shubenacadie is located in an area where they have very mild winters, as the temperature very seldom goes below zero. However, the work has now been done and from reports is entirely satisfactory. The cost was considerably less because of the materials supplied from Mount Pleasant Airport.

I would, therefore, recommend that payment be made at the earliest possible date.


