I spoke to Dr. Stone regarding the suggestion contained in the second paragraph of your letter and he considers that it would be a good idea to have a Wasserman Test made of all pupils in the school. If Dr. MacInnis is prepared to do this, the Department would allow him a special payment of fifty dollars (\$50.00) for his services in taking samples of blood of all the pupils. He can probably obtain the necessary tubes for the purpose free of charge from the Provincial Government but, if the Provincial Government makes a charge for these tubes, the Department will pay for them on receipt of their account, in duplicate.

Memorandum,

DR. SCOTT:

The report on the recent medical examination of the pupils of the Shubenacadie Indian Residential School indicates that 11 of them require operation for removal of tonsils and 11 others require correction of defects of vision. On a previous occasion Dr. O.B. Keddie, of Windsor, was nominated by the present Minister as the proper man to employ for the removal of tonsils. Messrs. Thomas J. Davis, of 564 Barrington Street, Halifax, and William P. Short, 90 $\frac{1}{2}$ Gottingden Street, Halifax, have been similarly nominated as suitable to supply glasses. These men are not eye specialists but optometrists.

The funds available for this work are very limited and we are not prepared to use more than \$200 for removal of 11 cases of tonsils, inclusive of the fees of the anaesthetist, who will be the local school physician, and possibly those of a nurse. The work will be done at the school. The amount available for the surgeon would not be over \$125.

The amount available for eye work is \$75 which must include the fees for examination and the cost of spectacles.

DR. SCOTT:

The report on the recent medical examination of the pupils of the Shubenacadie Indian Residential School indicates that 11 of them require operation for removal of tonsils and 11 others require correction of defects of vision. On a previous occasion Dr. O.B. Keddie, of Windsor, was nominated by the present Minister as the proper man to employ for the removal of tonsils. Messrs. Thomas J. Davis, of 564 Barrington Street, Halifax, and William P. Short, 90 $\frac{1}{2}$ Gottingden Street, Halifax, have been similarly nominated as suitable to supply glasses. These men are not eye specialists but optometrists.

The funds available for this work are very limited and we are not prepared to use more than \$200 for removal of 11 cases of tonsils, inclusive of the fees of the anaesthetist, who will be the local school physician, and possibly those of a nurse. The work will be done at the school. The amount available for the surgeon would not be over \$125.

The amount available for eye work is \$75 which must include the fees for examination and the cost of spectacles.

The Department has reason to believe that some of the pupils of the Indian Residential School at Shubenacadie are infected with syphilis, and wishes to have Wassermann Blood Tests made of all pupils in the school. It does not seem possible to make satisfactory arrangements to have this work done by the local physician, and I wish to inquire whether you have a Provincial Officer who could be assigned to do it. The Department is prepared to pay a nominal fee of \$50.00 for the service, which you will agree is designed to protect the health of the province at large as well as that of the pupils and staff of the school. It is known that you have Provincial Laboratory facilities for examination of the specimens of blood, and it is assumed that these facilities are available to the Department without charge, as such services have often been in the past.

If you can do this, it will be in order for you to make direct arrangements with Rev. J.P. Mackey, the Principal of the School, who is being instructed in this connection.

It may be well to add that it is the Department's intention to place any positive cases under active treatment, and it may possibly be necessary to ask you for some further assistance to this end.

You will find enclosed copy of letter which is being written to the Provincial Health Officer in connection with the matter referred to in your letter of March 1st. The Department also received a letter from Dr. McInnes stating that he would not undertake the work at the price offered. The Department is not disposed to employ Dr. McInnes for this work if arrangements can be made elsewhere. He could have taken these specimens a few at a time and have received a reasonable fee without much inconvenience to himself. You will see that the Provincial Health Officer is being asked to communicate direct with you, and it will not be necessary for you to communicate this information to Dr. McInnes.

The Department has met with a difficulty in making arrangements for removal of tonsils from pupils of your school and would prefer to delay this matter until a later date. Kindly report on it again about June 1st. You may offer a fee of \$75.00 to either Mr. Thomas J. Davis, of 564 Barrington Street, Halifax, or Mr. William P. Short, of 90½ Gottingden Street, Halifax, for the examination of the eyes of the eleven pupils mentioned in the middle column of your letter of February 19th. This fee is intended to cover not only the examinations but the supply of glasses as well. It is not large but it is as much as the Department can provide at the present time.
