Rev. Sir:

The Department has received the report of Mr. Inspector Barry on his inspection of the Alberni Indian Residential School in which he draws special attention to the fire alarm system. He states that he found the fire alarm battery out of order and that new batteries were required. He recommends that large size dry cells be used rather than the present 6 volt battery.

I have to request that you will take immediate steps to have the fire alarm system placed in a good, workable condition and ready for instant use in case of fire. You should see that this system is regularly tested and kept in proper working order at all times. In this connection I have to refer you to circular letter of February 5th, last, a copy of which is enclosed herewith, setting forth the Department's requirements to overcome fire hazard. It is expected that the principals of all residential schools will follow the instructions contained in the circular referred to and give this most important matter their serious attention. I shall be pleased to hear, at an early date, the action taken in having the alarm system at your school placed in good working condition.

EXTRACT from Inspector Barry's Report regarding his visit to the ALBERNI INDIAN RESIDENTIAL SCHOOL on April 26th, 1932. - Original on File 159-1-6.

It may be pointed out in passing that the provisions of the Department's letter 1-1-5 dated February 5, 1932, are not being complied with in this regard.

There is no direct exit from the senior dormitories to the fire escapes. The exit is in each case through a bath room, and then through a wash room. As recommended in my last report, boxes containing keys to the locked doors between the bathroom and the wash rooms in each case have now been provided. These boxes have glass fronts and are on the wall near the locked door on both the boys' and girls' sides of the school.

I beg to recommend the supply of 12 small mattresses and 12 large mattresses, to take the place of an equal number which are now of no further use.

XX

I found that the fire alarm battery, a 6 Volt Battery, was out of order. A hand bell was therefore rung for the alarm. It is impossible for me to understand how the Principal of a school where lives may be in danger at any time is content to leave things in this condition. A proper supply of large size dry cells would be far better than a 6 Volt Battery. They would not be as likely to run down; but in any case the fire alarm system should be regularly tested, and kept in proper working order.



Dear Sir:-

I visited the Alberni Residential School, and thoroughly inspected same. I found everything in the buildings and outbuildings very clean and tidy. In fact, though I searched thoroughly, I have no adverse criticism to make. There were one hundred and fourteen children in the school at the time of my visit. There had been a lot of influenza, but were all getting better. As it was a Saturday, the day of my visit, I did not hear the children in the classrooms. They were having meat stew, potatoes and carrots for their midday meal and bread and butter and beans for supper. I requested that the fire extinguishers be refilled. I again took up the matter of the locked window screens to the fire escapes, and after talking it over with the Principal, and at my earnest request, he promised to substitute wax seals instead, which, I understand, has been done. I don't think he will have any trouble in this connection. The jacket heater is in very poor condition. What is required there is a small tubular boiler.

The herd consists of from ten to fifteen dairy cows, with a well kept barn, and there should be plenty of milk for the children.

The manual training is being carried out, but seems to be in rather the commencement stage; possibly it will improve, but I am not sure whether the instructor is first-class. I believe it is rather hard to get a good man. I will look into this at my next visit.




