Dear Sir,-

With reference to my recent inspection of the Mount Elgin Indian Residential School, I would ask you to kindly obtain from one of the contractors on your approved list estimates of the cost of,-

1. Refacing the South wall of the Annex building with cement plaster finish.
2. Temporary exterior shoring of the North wall to prevent collapse.
3. Repointing and replacing brick, where necessary on school walls.

Regarding the heating system you might find out from Mr. Strapp, whether, in his opinion, it will be necessary to have a heating engineer make an inspection of this system. If this is not necessary he might advise you what is required to remedy the unsatisfactory condition of this system.

Dear Sir;

With reference to the matter of repairs to the heating system of this school, I beg to make the following recommendations:-

1. Differential tops and discs be supplied for all radiators to replace the existing packless valves and diaphragms which are not functioning properly.
2. That a vacuum pump and regulating valves with automatic control be installed and the thermostat be located in the Principal's apartment.
3. That an automatic stoker be installed in connection with the present E. Leonard & Sons return tubular boiler.

The above recommendations embody the main items in the report of the C.A. Dunham Co. engineer who inspected the heating system and forwarded his report to Mr. Orr in October 14th. 1935.

I would point out that the masonry and the roof ^{of the boiler room} are badly in need of attention. In fact if the roof is not very soon replaced the rafters and sheeting will become so rotten that extensive replacements will be necessary.

We propose to make repairs to Mt Elgin Resident School
as follows

Item 1 Plastering.

For removing present stucco from South wall of school and re-plastering and marking in squares entire south wall also repairing all places on East and West walls only where plaster has fallen off the price is Three Hundred and Sixty-Three (363.00) Dollars.

Item 2 Brickwork

For removing and re-building all brick arches in main building which are loose and out of place (8 in number) and pointing all other arches in building, also pointing wherever else necessary for Two Hundred and Seventy (270.00) Dollars.

Item 3 Shoring.

We propose to shore North wall of school building as follows for Four Hundred (400.00) Dollars.

Erect one post at East and West sides 3' from North corner about 20' long upright on wall. Erect 4 posts on North side about 16' long at intervals also upright. All posts to be fastened to wall with $3/8 \times 2\frac{1}{2}$ iron straps lagged to wall and posts.

Six braces from grade to posts on an angle of 45 degrees

Posts to be 8 x 10 made up of 2 x 10 bolted.

Braces to be 8 x 12 built up and bolted.

All braces to be fastened at bottom to dead man of 12 x 12

The dead man on North side to be continuous to take all braces and to be underground

Dear Mr. Gray,-

With reference to our conversation of May 31st, the heating system of the Mount Elgin Indian Residential School at Muncey, Ont. is in need of repairs and we would appreciate the advice of your engineers regarding the extent of repairs necessary to put the heating system of the main building into satisfactory condition.

Relative to previous reports from your engineer, the repairs under consideration at the moment are:-

1. To supply and install differential top and discs for all radiators to replace the leaking packless valves and diaphragms which are not functioning properly.
2. That a vacuum pump and regulating valves with automatic control be installed and the thermostat be located in the Principal's Office.


I would like to point out that the intention is to repair the system only to the extent of providing adequate and satisfactory heating for the building. I would therefore appreciate the advice of your engineer as to the soundness and extent of the above repairs, or advise as to further, or alternative repairs, as might be required under the circumstances.

A brief specification covering - 1. The replacement of existing valves and the number of differential top and disc units required. 2. The material and equipment required for the installation of the vacuum pump, automatic control and thermostat.

Overpayments, Indian Affairs Branch

On January 13th last cheque 37795 was issued to H.M. Davis in part payment of a plumbing contract carried out at Mount Elgin Residential School. The balance of the account \$250.97 was paid in 1937-38. On page 8 of the account appears the following item, "384 ft. 4" sewer tile, 20¢ per ft. = \$92.16". As this should read \$76.80, there would appear to be an overpayment of \$15.36.

Cheque 52977 for \$9.10 issued to R.F. Hillhouse on April 28th, 1937, duplicates a \$2.00 payment to Stanley and Malcolm Saulteaux.

Please recover these overpayments as soon as possible.



On receipt of the above noted account from you and your letter of April 15th, the sum of \$138.85 was deducted from this account leaving a total of \$2,750.97.

As Mr. Davis had previously been paid \$2,500.00 on account, cheque No. 3271 amounting to \$250.97 was forwarded to him on May 11th, in payment of the balance. However, another error has been found on Page 8 of the account. On repairs to Outside Drainage he has included an item of 384 feet of 4-inch sewer tile at 20¢ per foot at \$92.16, whereas, the correct amount of this item should be \$76.80, thus making an overpayment of \$15.36. Will you please obtain a refund of this amount from Mr. Davis and forward it to this office with a Receiver General payment form and an explanatory letter.


Dear Sir,-

In connection with the proposed improvements to the heating system at the Mount Elgin Indian Residential School it will be necessary to know the exact number of radiators which will require new tops and discs on the traps and new diaphragms and orifice plates on the valves. It will also be necessary to know the number of drip traps required to be installed on mains.

Regarding the general repairs and regrading of piping and insulation will you please forward any definite information available on the work necessary. This information will be required in connection with the Dushan Company's recommendation forwarded from their engineer on his recent visit. If you are not familiar with the details of this work the information might be obtained from Mr. Strapp.

In connection with the new agency building for yourself and the doctor any information regarding the sewage disposal would be appreciated.







Attention, Mr. J. E. Dudley.
Surveys and Engineering Branch.

I would acknowledge receipt of your letter of June 29th, with reference to the proposed improvements to the heating system at the Mount Elgin Residential School and not being familiar with this system I did request the Rev. Principal of the school to give the necessary information.

Mr. Strapp reports that the number of radiators requiring diaphragms, new tops and orifice plates on the valves is sixty-nine. One radiator will require the removal of a cracked section.

Regarding the general repairs and regrading of pipes and installation of drip traps Mr. Strapp reports that this information can only be obtained by an expert with the necessary levels.

With further reference to repairs at Mount Elgin School Mr. Strapp reports a very severe leak in the roof of the main building that needs attention, also that the lightning rod system needs over-hauling on the buildings many of which are useless due to broken ground wires, etc. These repairs could be looked into on your next visit to this Agency, which I understand will be in the near future.

I would advise you that the Rev. Principal of Mount Elgin School has brought to my attention the urgent need of repairs to the ceiling of the second floor boys' dormitory.

On making an inspection I found a considerable portion of ceiling had dropped on the beds in this room and to make it safe and avoid accidents, loose plaster would have to be removed for a space of 15 by 18 feet.

Kindly grant the necessary authority to have this work done as soon as possible and before the children return from their vacation.

It would be necessary to engage a white plasterer for this work and the repaired ceiling would have to be repapered.

This work can be done by plaster to be used on other repair work.

The Principal of this School visited the Department today and advised me that the work had not yet commenced. Included in the repairs is the reconditioning of the heating system, and, with the approach of colder weather, it is very necessary to have this system in proper working order.

I would appreciate if you would instruct your Engineers to proceed at once with the repairs at the Mt. Elgin Residential School.
