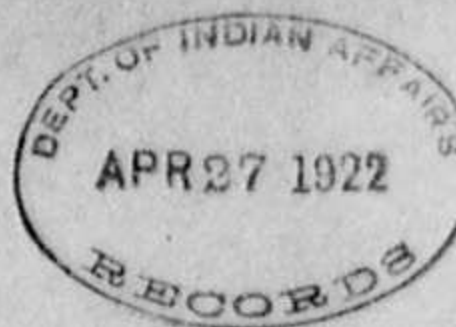

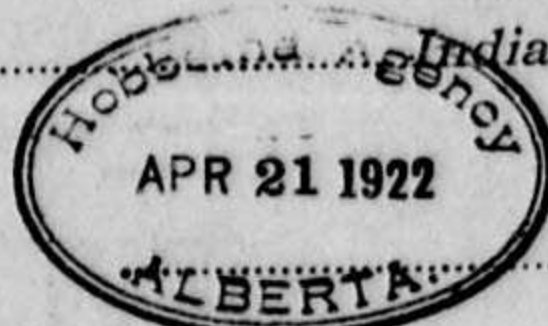

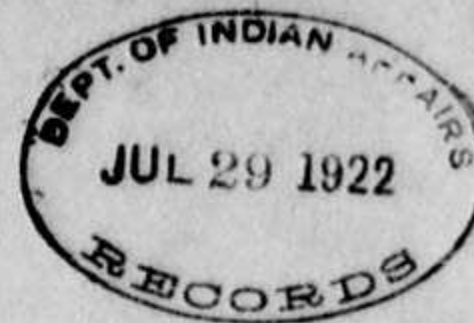

Sir: -

In a recent report on the Samson's and Louis Bull Indian Day Schools, Inspector Christianson states that the Rev. Mr. Taylor, who is in charge of the Methodist missionary work in the Agency, suggests that a midday meal be supplied at the above schools during the winter months. It appears that the only supplies required would be a little meat, rice and a few vegetables to make soup.

Kindly advise the Department if you consider the supplying of midday meals would increase the attendance at these schools, and also furnish an estimate of the probable amount of the above mentioned supplies that would be required at each school, and the cost of same.

It is presumed that, if this is authorized, the teacher of each school would arrange for the preparation of this meal without expense to the Department.

Sir,—

With reference to your letter No. 112-7-5, dated October 31 last, and to the supplying of a midday meals at the day schools. I beg to inform you that I have taken this matter up with the teachers of the Day Schools.

The teacher of the Louis Bull Day School does not wish to undertake the preparation of a midday meal at his school.

The teacher of Samson's Day School will look after a meal for the pupils at noon. I would suggest that a little flour, rice, beef and baking powder be supplied for this school. The average attendance has been about 12. I think that if the midday meal were given a trial again at this school it would be an encouragement to the children to attend more regularly during the winter months.

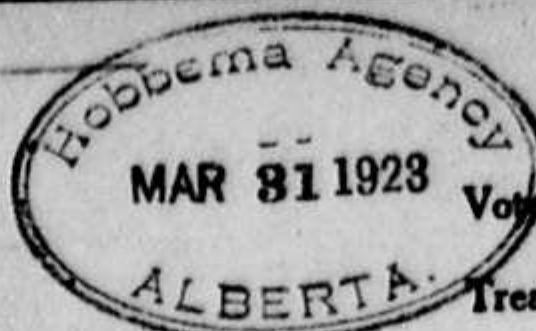

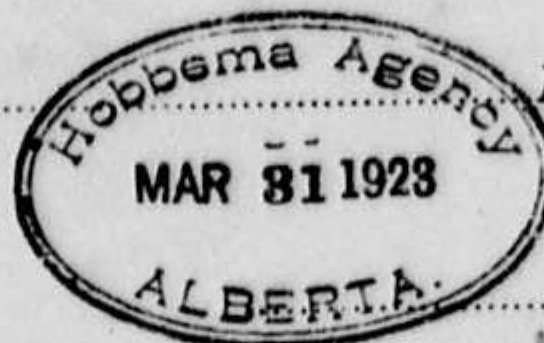


I have to request that you will consult the teacher of the Samson's Indian Day School with reference to the supplying of a midday lunch to the pupils. If she will undertake the work of preparing and serving a lunch, with the assistance of the older girls, you may arrange for the purchase and delivery of a small quantity of flour, rice, beef, tea, sugar, salt and baking powder. Only the quantity sufficient to provide a midday lunch for a month should be purchased at one time, and when these supplies are exhausted, you should then arrange for the purchase of a further quantity. No unnecessary expenditure should be incurred, and only the supplies absolutely necessary should be obtained. Properly certified vouchers, in duplicate, should be forwarded covering the expenditure incurred. You will be good enough to see that these supplies are delivered to the teacher and placed in her care. The Department will expect you to give this matter your early attention, after you have consulted the teacher as to the quantities of the various supplies that would be required.

Regarding the janitor's services, I have to request that you will see that he performs his duties in a satisfactory manner. It is expected that he will see that the classroom is swept and dusted each day, and scrubbed at least once a month. He should also attend to the lighting of the fires in sufficient time in the mornings to have the classroom warm when the pupils arrive. It is also expected that he will do any snow shovelling that may be required.

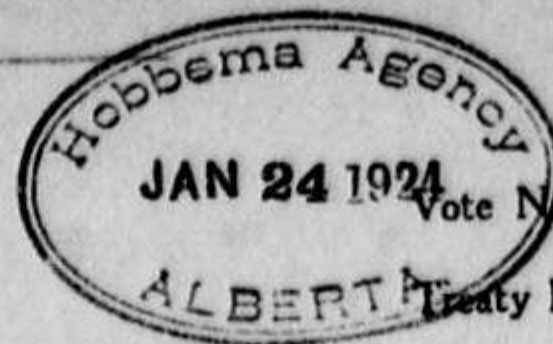

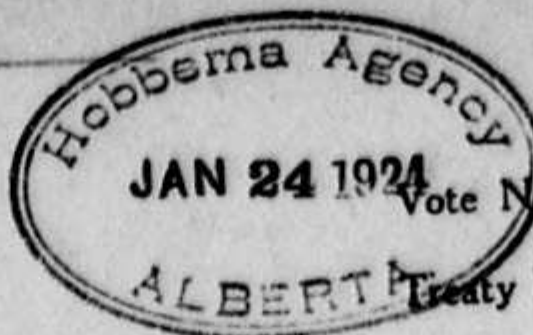
