

Dear Mr. Scott:-

We have just about completed our water system. I am sending you, under separate cover, sketch showing extent and character of work done. Everything has been purchased save gasoline engine, and I would greatly like the consent of the Department to use our present engine as indicated, and apply the price of a four horse engine ^(\$300.00) on the purchase of a Delco Lighting System to be used in the Main Building.

Said system will cost \$600.00 installed. We will pay the \$300.00 out of school funds. To install, we will simply connect at switch entering the Main Building, and will not disturb wiring in any possible way. We would use present dynamo for street and barns and engine for pumping water.

My reasons for suggesting this change are:-

1. During the dark days we need a few lights in lower kitchen, halls, and girls' playroom all the time. This means lighting and carrying around of lamps by the pupils.
2. We need a few lights in Main Halls all night. This means lamps, matches, etc.
3. There are times, especially in cold weather, when it is difficult to get the gas engine started promptly in the morning. This, again, means running for lamps, etc, and once in a while the engine will stop, belt slip, or some other little thing happen when pupils are coming in to supper, and, again, it is

lamps, matches, etc.

All this greatly increases the danger of fire.

In matters of fire in a building of this kind the great concern must always be prevention.

4. To run the big engine just for a few lights is too expensive.
5. Our present dynamo is 110 volt, and this would mean a very large and expensive battery, if we attempted that solution. Besides, the Dynamo has been running steadily about eight years, and of course will soon show effect of wear.
6. This all brings me back to the purchase of Delco plant as the best and easiest solution. It is fully guaranteed, will be installed on free trial, will give all lights necessary for Main Building. It's storage battery provides 20 lights for 16 hours - more than we would ever need- It will cost about one-half for running expense. It will greatly reduce risk of fires by doing away entirely with matches and lamps. It will not cost the Department any more than to purchase engine for pumping. We will provide the extra \$300.00

I know of several Delco plants lighting farm premises, and, in every case it is giving best of satisfaction. They use a low voltage lamp, but offer to exchange lamp for lamp with us.


Our large engine would run barn lights from 7. to 8 am., and from 3 to 6 pm., and at same time pump all water needed.

I hope I have made the matter sufficiently clear, and that the Department will approve of the suggestion, and, at least, permit a two weeks trial pf plant, as suggested by the Delco people.

Pleased to say our total expenditure for water system will not exceed amount appropriated.

Rev. Sir,-

I beg to acknowledge the receipt of your letter dated the 24th ultimo in reference to new water-system at Mount Elgin Institute, also ground plan showing the position of gathering-basins, pipe-lines, etc. The plan of the work as outlined, appears satisfactory as far as shown. It is noted, however, that no provision has been made for outside fire-hydrants for the protection of the building, into which the water can be pumped direct in case of fire, although this may have been arranged for by you, but not shown on the plan.

A report showing the completed work to date, with the results obtained, should be at once sent in that the conditions may be fully understood.

With reference to the lighting system in the school, I quite understand that night-lights would be an advantage, and as it is believed the lighting system proposed would supply these more economically than to provide storage batteries in connection with

with the present system, permission will be given for a trial installation of the Delco light, on the understanding that the plant will be removed, if unsatisfactory, without cost to the school or Department, any expense in connection therewith being paid for by the Company installing same. And in the event of this test being satisfactory, the Department will approve of the present lighting engine being utilized for pumping, and \$300.00 being paid on account of the Delco system, as on the terms stated in your letter.

A reasonable guarantee as to the effectiveness, durability and satisfactory permanent service of the lighting plant should be obtained before payment is made.


