Please find enclosed Agent's Report form on a visit of inspection made to the Mount Elgin Indian Residential school on the 29th of June.

The Rev. O. B. Strapp, Principal of this School requests that additional space be provided to accommodate his classes in weaving and makes a suggestion that for \$500.00 he could erect a suitable building and use the present concrete root-cellar for the foundation of such a building.

I am not enthused at the idea of building new additions at Mount Elgin School and do consider that the present buildings being old, will soon need a large expense in repairs and upkeep and that consideration should soon be given to the erection of a new modern school, providing it is intended to go into an extensive manual training programme. I also believe that through the aid being given Indians to re-establish themselves on their reserves, there should be less need of placing children in a residential school like Mount Elgin in future years and that children will be reared by their parents and not in a boarding school.

If a policy of sending fewer children to a residential school like Mount Elgin was pursued and the enrollment cut by a third at least it would leave a lot of space available at the school to use for manual training and technical training, without building additional buildings. It is suggested that an official of the Department visit Mount Elgin school at an early date to make a complete report in this connection and its future possibilities.

I am in receipt of your letter of the 7th instant with reference to the request of the Principal of the Mount Elgin residential school for an allowance of \$500.00 in order to provide additional accommodation for the vocational training classes.

Very careful consideration has been given to the contents of your letter. The Department feels that vocational training is so important that every possible facility should be provided. The situation mentioned in your letter may eventually occur but in the meantime we will have obtained full value for any expenditure made in providing extra accommodation for vocational work. Please let me have detailed information regarding the material required in order that purchase may be made through our Purchasing Branch. You should also state if it will be necessary to employ any white labour. If so, the tradesmen should be stated.

Encl. I would acknowledge receipt of your letter 7-0-5 of July 17th, concerning the erection of a manual training building at Mount Elgin Residential School and to comply with your request, please find enclosed a detailed list of the materials needed which has been supplied by the Reverend Principal of the school.

Mr. Strapp states that considerable of the work to be done in the erection of this building will be supplied from his own staff and pupils and the balance can be done by local Indian labour without the necessity of employing white labour.

If the sum of \$500.00 is available for the building it is suggested that the balance of this sum, after the material has been purchased, be sent forward for the payment of wages of the labour necessary.







I would acknowledge receipt of your letter 7-0-5 of the 2nd. instant concerning building materials asked for by the Rev. Mr. Strapp to erect a manual training building at Mount Elgin Residential School.

The Principal of the school is away on two weeks vacation at the present time so I have consulted a lumber firm and am informed as follows,

Bevelled Siding; 1,875 feet board measure (8" wide) is also known as clap board siding and is generally supplied in cedar or fir. Cedar is the cheaper of the two.

Water Table; 200 ft. This would be for 200 lineal feet being 6 inches wide with a drip cap and of cedar or fir material of  $1\frac{1}{2}$  or  $1\frac{3}{4}$  thickness. This board is installed at the bottom of the siding to shed water from the foundation of the building.

MR. HOEY

Following my attendance at the teachers' convention at the Oneida No. 2 school Indian Agent Moore accompanied me to the Mount Elgin Institute. All the materials for the manual training building have not yet arrived but the material that is missing is expected within a week.

It will require about \$150.00 for labour. The balance of the labour will be done by the school management.

I recommend that repairs be made to the railings of the verandah at the front of the school and that this be painted. The Indian Agent, Mr. Moore, and the Principal, Mr. O.B. Strapp, estimated that the cost of doing this work would not exceed \$200.00 for material and labour. Indians would be employed to do the necessary work.


