

Sir:

Acknowledgement is made of your letter of the 15th instant, with enclosed correspondence as stated, with reference to the new Gilson engine recently installed in the Kootenay Indian Residential School in connection with the new water supply system.

As I have already informed you this matter has been under consideration since the report was received of the unsatisfactory condition of the Gilson engine as installed.

In view of all the circumstances and following consultation with Mr. Indian Commissioner Ditchburn, I have decided not to accept the Gilson engine and have arranged with the B.C. Equipment Company, who supplied it, for its return. In its place the B.C. Equipment Company have kindly offered to furnish a latest type Petter Atomic Deisel 7 H.P. engine. This is a cold starting deisel engine of a new type which was not available when tenders were called for this project.

I have arranged with the B.C. Equipment Company that they will remove the Gilson engine and ship it back to the factory. They will then install the new Petters at a total cost installed, to us, of \$750. This work will be carried out at once. The new engine will require a larger exhaust pipe than at present installed. The cost of this item will be in the neighborhood of \$30.00.

I will therefore require a further \$385. to cover the cost of the purchase and installation of the improved engine. You will of course appreciate that this engine is of a much higher grade than the Gilson engine which is being returned, and is of British manufacture.

I am enclosing a statement showing my account with reference to the installation of engine.



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

I beg to acknowledge receipt of your circular letter of February 5, 1932, file No. 1-1-5, with reference to fire protection at Indian Residential Schools.

I beg to report that the fire escapes at Kootenay Indian Residential School are in very good condition, they are kept in good repair and free from snow and ice, and unlocked exits open out. Fire drill is carried out every two weeks and regular inspections of the building are made, the Reverend Principal always making the inspection at midnight.

The Reverend Principal has given very close attention to fire protection at Kootenay Residential School. I beg to point out, however, that while the school now has a supply of pure spring water for domestic purposes, it is not sufficient for fire protection. Water may be obtained for this purpose from Joseph Creek, as recommended by Mr. Engineer Warren, and I would respectfully recommend that this be done when funds are available for the purpose.

With reference to the subject of a small generator for your battery charging which we discussed.

I now have particulars of what we can offer for a complete installation to use with the PETER Atomic engine you have.

In order to keep the cost of this within reasonable limits we have put in a used generator which though oversize would be most suitable for your load conditions. The drive would be the "V" belt type which we suggested to you, and this would enable you to make a very compact installation close to the engine and away from the possibility of damage by wet from the relief valve on the pump discharge. The items are set out below.

One-only used Canadian Westinghouse generator, shunt wound 1700 rpm, complete with rails and rhoestat.

One-only "V" belt drive with sheaves approx 6" and 16" with 3 belts 21/32 x 7/16 on approx 20" centres

Price complete delivered fob Cranbrook B.C. \$ 225.00

The bolt-on type of pulley we have quoted on would be easily fitted to the flywheel but it is quite possible that the ordinary type of pulley would be suitable as the three belts will only take up a small amount of room. This latter pulley would be even more easy to fit.

We would be glad if you will make clear what terms you are considering on this as from your conversation we appreciate that you would ask us to allow you some time to complete payment.

The cost of lighting the school with fuel oil would be less than one half of the cost from gasoline as at present.
