



MEMORANDUM:

Mr. Scott.

With reference to the attached memorandum referring to the domestic water supply system for the St. Eugene Mission at Cranbrook, I beg to say that on July 24th the Dominion Water Power Branch, who had been asked to investigate and report on a satisfactory water supply system, stated that a spring had been located which appeared to be a suitable source of supply for the school. Tests were being made as to the quality and purity of the spring and a further report would be submitted.

On November 7th a letter was written to the Director of the Dominion Water Power Branch, advising that the Department had not yet received a further report and asking that same be forwarded as early as possible. To date no further advice has been received from the Dominion Water Power Branch, and therefore no work has been authorized.

Dear Sir;

I am submitting to you for the consideration of the Department, the enclosed voucher for installation of ventilators in our school dormitories.

On examining the dormitories last summer we found that ventilators were an absolute necessity and as these contractors were working on repairs to the fire escapes at the time I asked them to install the ventilators for us. Since their installation these ventilators have amply justified their use, as we have fresh air all the time in dormitories which previously were filled with very bad odors and very harmful to the children when in use.

They were installed at the lowest cost obtainable, and as they are a new installation and not a repair, and especially as we need all our grant for the maintenance of the school, I wish you to ask the Department if they will pay this account for me.
