Sir:

I have to inform you that, some months ago, the Department promised the Woman's Missionary Society of the then Presbyterian Church to reimburse the management of the Alberni Indian Residential School to the extent of \$300 if they prepared a suitable outdoor residence for Mr. Johnson, a married teacher on the staff. I wish to arrange for payment of this grant at this time and I have to request you to have Mr. George Forest, of Alberni, proceed to the school at his convenience and, after examining the residence in question, give you a written valuation. This should be forwarded to the Department along with a voucher, in duplicate, for \$300, in favour of the school principal. The voucher might read as follows:
