Sir,

Re Indian School at Kenora.

In further reference to your letter of July 18th last regarding the sewage disposal system at the Roman Catholic school at Kenora, I enclose herewith a report prepared by Mr. Gow dealing with this subject.

Two schemes are suggested for consideration, one making use of the existing septic tank and the filter chamber and providing for the reconstruction of the disposal bed, at an estimated cost of \$1600.; the other providing for complete reconstruction of the septic tank and disposal beds and separate provision for laundry waste, at an estimated cost of \$4000.

I understand that Mr. Gow has discussed this matter with the Departmental Architect and that they have reached an agreement as to the most satisfactory method of dealing with this matter under existing conditions.

Replying to your letter of 11th. inst.  
re report to your Board on the 2nd. that the  
Sceptic Tank at the Kenora R.C. School wasn't  
functioning properly, and the resolution passed  
thereon.

We beg to advise you that an amount has been  
put in the Estimates for the remodelling and re-  
building the Sewage disposal plant at the School.

Owing to the low water in the lake, the  
outlet pipe from the present disposal plant froze  
up, and caused a stoppage a short time ago.

On the recommendation of the Acting Chief  
Engineer, of the Dominion Water Power Branch and  
Reclamation Bureau, the Department decided to  
make temporary repairs, until we had the money  
voted for the remodelling, and this was done as  
follows:- The Tank has been cleaned out, and the  
contents disposed of. Broken Pipes have been removed  
and replaced by new ones. Drains have been cleaned  
and the Syphon put in order, the Outlet to the Lake  
has been taken up and rearranged so that it will  
discharge into a Gravel Bed before entering the Lake,  
and so far as we have been able to learn, there is  
no trouble with the system at present.

In company with Dr. A.D. Ferguson, Medical  
Officer of Health, and Mr. Chas. Hatchford, who  
made the temporary repairs, I inspected the work,  
and we were unable to find any spot where unfiltered  
sewage entered the Lake.

Dear Sir:-

At the last regular meeting of the Local Board of Health held Monday, February 2nd., 1931, the matter of protection of the Town's water supply came up for discussion and it was reported that the septic tank at the Roman Catholic Indian School, near the Devil's Gap, was not functioning properly.

It was, therefore, felt advisable to request the co-operation of your Department in protecting the water supply of our citizens, and ask that some immediate steps be taken to remedy this situation. As a result of the discussion, the following resolution was passed:-

"WHEREAS it has been reported that the septic tank used for sewage disposal at the Roman Catholic Indian School is not functioning properly, and WHEREAS the sewage from such institution is not now being properly treated before being deposited in the Lake of the Woods a short distance above the Town of Kenora's water supply intake pipe, THEREFORE, be it resolved that this Board draw to the attention of the Department of Indian Affairs through the Local Agent Captain F. Edwards, the danger to the citizens of Kenora through such conditions and request him to take up with the Department the matter of having such condition remedied at the earliest possible moment."

It would be very much appreciated if you would do what you can to have this dangerous condition alleviated.



I wish to refer to the last paragraph of your 108-12 of October 3rd, last, with reference to the heating of the new addition at the Kenora Indian Residential School. Will you please have the Reverend Principal secure a report from Brother Gauthier on the need for the additional radiators in the Sisters' room and on the difficulties in heating the new wing.

I am informed by one of the church officers that there is a fire hazard at the base of the main chimney at this Indian Residential School. It appears that some of the woodwork is in danger of catching fire. The Department would request you to have this inspected immediately, and, if remedial measures can be taken without much expense, please make the improvement without delay. If the cost would be considerable, please let the Department have an immediate report and recommendation.

re Indian Residential Schools, in this Agency:-

Kenora, R.C. School:- We had trouble with the sewage disposal plant here, in January, owing to the low water in the lake, and on the recommendation of the Acting Chief Engineer of the Dominion Water Power and reclamation Bureau, the Department decided to make temporary repairs, until we had the money voted for the remodelling, and this was done, as follows:- Tank cleaned out, and contents disposed of, broken pipes removed, and replaced by new ones, Drains cleaned out, and Syphon put in order. Outlet to the lake, taken up and rearranged so it will discharge into a gravel bed, before entering the lake.

In company with Dr. A.D. Ferguson, Medical Officer of Health, and Mr. Chas. Ratchford, who made the repairs, I inspected the work, and we were unable to find any spot, where unfiltered sewage entered the lake, and that the system at present is much better, than it has been in years.

Sioux Lookout School:- We were not aware of the fact that owing to the low water, the end of the original effluent is now exposed some 15 feet above the normal water line. As this outlet is below the Rapids, there is no danger, now or at any other time of pollution at the intake of the water supply, or for the water supply for the town of Sioux Lookout or the National Railways.

As the soil at this point appears to be gravel with clay overburden, I think that there would be a suitable location for a filtration bed. This would be very desirable in view of the fact that the present contamination affects the watershed which may at some future time supply the town of Sioux Lookout and which at present supplies the Canadian National Railways at Sioux Lookout.

With respect to the Indian Residential School, R. C. at McIntosh, I made an inspection here some time ago and found that while all other conditions at the school are exceptionally good, that a similar condition with respect to sewage disposal exists at this school as at Pelican.


The septic tank effluent is passed into the lake without preliminary treatment of any description. I wish to make it perfectly clear that ordinary treatment by sedimentation in a septic tank only removes 25 to 75% of the bacteria present in the sewage. Where, however, the septic tank is combined with either broad irrigation filters or contact beds the percentage removal of bacteria is increased 10 to 15%.

I submit these points for the most earnest consideration of your Department. They have already been laid before the Department of Public Health for this province.

I would also wish to express my appreciation of the highly efficient way in which the schools at Pelican and McIntosh are conducted. The administrative bodies at both schools display an interest in child welfare as associated with education, which, speaking as a Public Health Officer, commends itself to me very much.

I should be glad to have your observations on this matter.

Re Indian Schools

I would be much obliged if you could inform me as to what your Department intends doing in connection with the sewage disposal system of the Indian Residential R. C. School, Kenora, concerning which we have had some correspondence in the past.

With respect to the Indian Residential School, Anglican, at Pelican, I would beg to draw your attention to a condition examined by me on the occasion of a survey made some time ago.

*Sioux Lookout*

The sewage disposal at this point is effected by means of a septic tank, the effluent from which is conducted directly into the lake without any further treatment. At the time of my inspection there was a considerable area of the beach polluted with effluvia. This was due to the fact that there was low water and the end of the original effluent is now exposed some 15 ft. above the normal water line. Wastes from the laundry and kitchen are on a separate system and do not pass through the tank. The above mentioned effluent is located on the west side of the bay around the point and about 700 ft. from the water intake. The direction of the current is downstream from the intake. I should say at the present time that I do not think there is any danger of pollution of the water supply.


