We wish to thank you for your letter of the 1st instant in regard to the electrical service at our Cecilia Jeffrey Indian Residential School.

In the penultimate paragraph of your letter you recommend that consideration should be given to the supplying of a weather proof enclosure for metering equipment and main service switch, in the event that the school should become a Hydro-Electric customer. Could you supply us with the specifications of the type of enclosure you would recommend.

In your letter you do not let us know the initial cost of the actual installation of Hydro Service, and before any decision can be reached this information has to be obtained.



Please be advised that we have completed our general inspection of the electrical installation in the above mentioned premises prior to becoming a customer of the Hydro-Electric Power Commission of Ontario, Kenora Rural Operating Area and the following defects were found to be in evidence:

Remove all worn and frayed drop cords where they are used as line wire and switch legs over doorways, around molding and over dressers and beds in the dormitory as well as staff quarters replacing same with convenience receptacles and properly installed switches on the lighting circuits.

Replace broken light switch in hospital ward.

Reinstal the two bracket lights over the kitchen sink in the residence using proper materials.

Instal proper convenience ironing receptacles along with pilot lights in the laundry.

Rewire all ceiling fixtures where fixture cords appear to be worn and frayed.

Exit lighting throughout the building to be installed at locations suitable to the Fire Marshall or his representative.

Barn, workshop, and chicken coop wiring were found to be in a hazardous condition. Same to be completely rewired using proper type materials.

As the above mentioned defects constitute a serious hazard to life and property it will be necessary for you to have them remedied by securing the services of a competent electrician and arrangements made with this office for another inspection.

In regards to the two existing 200 ampere lighting services, one being located in the laundry and the other located in the shoe storage room in the basement of the main building, we would recommend that some thought be taken into consideration for the necessity of installing a weatherproof enclosure on the new proposed transformer pole which will be erected at the rear of the building just off the garage driveway and in line with the now existing Rural line on the Rabbit Lake Road. This enclosure will house the main service switch and metering equipment for all buildings, also an additional weatherproof enclosure should be installed on an adjacent pole which will house the 220 volt, 3 phase service and metering equipment.

Should you require further information in regards to this matter kindly advise us at once.

Dear Mr. Paterson:

Re: ELECTRICAL SERVICE

In reply to your later dated November
24th, 1949:

I feel that this is a matter which
requires expert opinion. It would be a pity if, because
of an opinion voiced by me, a change were made in the
electrical services for this school, this change proving
later not to be beneficial. I feel sure that there must
be men of your Department much better qualified than I to
decide upon the relative merits of Hydre and other sources
of power supply.

The copy of certain correspondence
received by your Department from the Municipality of Jaffray
and Melick, forwarded to me by yourself, puts forward no
suggestions as to possible advantages for this school which
might result from this change. Reasons given refer only to
probable advantages to th Municipality concerned.

The only possible considerations which
might influence me in voicing an opinion would be the
probable comparative cost, and the relative efficiency of
service to be expected. Whatever expenditure might be
involved in the actual change to be made would hardly be a
relative consideration, when thinking of a long-term
contract.

Enclosed: I feel able to make no further comments.


Last year similar condition was noted and though

Re DISPOSAL BED

The disposal bed for the sewage system of this school is again giving evidence that it is not functioning properly. For several days water to a depth of from eight to ten inches has been in evidence above the ground in the disposal field. It is without doubt seepage from the bed.

While there is no immediate cause for alarm, I thought it advisable to bring this to your attention. There is little doubt that the new toilets have relieved the system of a considerable portion of the volume of fluid which it used previously be obliged to carry. We have as a result had no difficulty at all with the sewage system this winter. The seepage in evidence may indicate only a break in one or more parts of the tile field.


