Dear Sir:-

Enclosed please find voucher #5306 for \$159. 09,
expended on the new addition to the Kenora Indian
Residential School.

The Principal informs me that this was authorised
in connection with the new addition, but I cannot find
the Departments authority on my files.

The amount of \$30.60 for doors to fire escapes
was authorised by me, as it was absolutely essential
to enable the children to get out in case of fire.

I enclose letter received from the Principal, in
which he asks an appropriation of \$1300.00 to repair
the road to the school. This road is in bad shape,
and the school authorities apparently do very little
work on it. We could probably obtain cinders from
the C.P.R., and if the school authorities or the
Department would pay for the labour of hauling, a
passable road could be made at much less cost than
estimated by the Principal.

I also enclose letter re the heating system. This
was put in good shape a short time ago by Neale and
Yeats of Brandon, and the heating of the new addition
was done by the Campbell Heating Co., of Kenora. Mr
Campbell informs me that he thinks the reason is,
the school authorities put a fire on, then do not
keep it up, hence the trouble; so I am writing the
Principal requesting him to have Brother Gautier
make a report, as any previous reports we have
received from him, always seem reasonable and honest.

FIRST PROPOSAL -

Install a 2500 Gallon per hour Fairbanks-Morse Pump connected on the same base with a Three Horse Power Motor, the pump to be chain driven - Install 1000 feet of 4" suction line into the Lake; friction loss at this suction line would be 2.20 feet per hundred - On this suction line it would be necessary to place a 4" foot valve and also on the pump installation a relief valve along with the check valves and globe valves required - The electric work to be done in the approved manner with entrance switch, pressure switch and starting switch.

This proposal is the proper and thorough way to install this job -

The cost of carrying out the work according to this proposal would be Two Thousand and Seventy-Three (\$2073.00) Dollars.



The Work required to be done at present
in connection with the Indian Residential
School R.C. Kenora sewage system is as follows:-

Clean out both Chambers of Main Septic Tank.
clear pipe line between Main Septic tank and
filter tank, and repair broken tile, remove rock
and gravel from filter tank. Clean out Filter
Tank and all connections. Put back filter rock
and cover with new gravel. Take up end of discharge
from filter tank and continue line to present low
water level shore line. Cover this line which will
be 20 or 30 feet with gravel, earth, manure or
other filling.

The above work including excavation work
should cost between \$250:00 and \$300:00.
