Reverend Sir:

This will be your authority to arrange for a dental clinic at the Spanish Indian Residential School. The work is to be offered to Doctor W. E. Boyd, of Espanola, and the fee allowed is \$30.00 per day, the dentist to provide his own materials for extractions and simple fillings. A maximum of six days' work is authorized by this letter. If this does not nearly cover the requirements it might be possible to have another clinic in the fall. Probably you will not wish to have more than this number of days done at the present time.

Doctor Boyd may be allowed actual return railway fare from Espanola to Spanish to compensate him for his outlay in travelling. It is assumed that he will be accommodated at the school without charge.

His account should be presented in the manner usual to Doctors and dentists and on the correct stationery. It is not necessary that the account should contain the names of pupils treated but the number of fillings and extractions must be given. You will wish to keep a record of the work done for each pupil.

The Department anticipates that good work will be done and, from experience in other places, has come to expect rather a long day's work at these







Reverend Sir:

Reference your letter June 7
Tonsil clinic Spanish Indian Residential School.

I scarcely think you expect the Department to authorize seven tonsil operations without the certificate of the Medical Officer and without knowing that the parents of the children concerned have given their consent to the operations. It is not prepared to authorize the clinic without these assurances. It would be wise for you to obtain them without too much delay in view of the early close of the school year. To remove any possible misunderstanding which seems to have existed in the past it seems necessary that I point out clearly the authority which both you and the Department must have for surgical operations, admissions to hospital etc. is that of the Physician.

There are 2 children, Florence Meganegone, age 11 yrs. and Clara Bissailon age 14, in your Gilra's School suffering from active pulmonary tuberculosis as confirmed by the chest clinic held at Espanola June 12/37.

The chest clinic recommended that these 2 children be placed in a Sanatorium. In any event these 2 children should be discharged from the school as there is no arrangement to segregate and treat tuberculosis cases there.

With reference to your letter of October 13th, file 36-0-13 I would say that two or three days dental work would be required. I say that because the department allowed for six days last spring. Cf file 36-0-13, date May 13th. When the work was done there were 105 extractions and 89 fillings. At present approximately 30 extractions and 24 fillings are necessary.

The clinic could be held at this school as in the past.
