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

This will acknowledge receipt of your memorandum of August 7th, in which you ask to have necessary repairs carried out under the supervision of one of our officers.

The Financial Encumbrance for \$1,832.00, to cover the cost of the work, has subsequently been received from your office.

Extract 2

On account of the numerous other projects which we have already on hand, and for which we have not sufficient staff to deal with promptly, we would prefer it if, as indicated in Mr. Mills' memorandum of July 26th, your Branch would obtain approval for the expenditure and authorize Indian Agent Rice to accept the tender. The work would then be supervised by our Mr. Ross, and the accounts, after certification by the Indian Agent, should be forwarded directly to Indian Affairs Branch in Ottawa, for payment.

It is thought that the procedure indicated above will secure the most prompt results, and will, therefore, prove to be the most satisfactory to your Branch.

If agreeable to you, therefore, we will return your Financial Encumbrance for \$1,832.00.

Memorandum:

DEPUTY MINISTER

Painting of Shubenacadie Day School.

The Contractor for the construction of the above school in 1945 was D.A. MacDonald. His work has not proved to be satisfactory.

A memorandum from Surveys and Engineering dated 30th July, reads as follows:

"It would appear that during construction of the school lumber was used which was not completely dry partly due to uncontrollable circumstances. Also, it would seem that when the contractor learned he was going to lose money on the project, he skimmed on the paint job, probably on the quality of the paint, and which job may not have been sufficiently closely inspected.

"The combination of these two causes has resulted in the present unsatisfactory condition. I may say that similar conditions exist in many recently erected buildings in Ottawa."

Mr. H.E. Russell who is doing the painting for the Kenney Construction Company on the present buildings at Shubenacadie, has submitted the attached tender for the work required.

Mr. Morris has recommended the acceptance of his tender. The Director of the Surveys and Engineering Branch has also recommended its acceptance and has agreed to supervision by Mr. Ross.
