Dear Minister,

I fear that it has taken some time to reply to your letter of December 23rd 1942 about the future of the Mohawk Institute, but it was necessary for the New England Company to take legal advice, and to ascertain the views of the Charity Commission as to how far the proposition in your letter was consistent with the Company's Charter.

The Court of the Company are advised that they are not at liberty under their Charter to transfer the freehold of the Institute to your Department as you propose without consideration. On the other hand the Company have every wish to facilitate the general scheme which you have proposed. The Company must, however, stipulate that the teachings of the Church of England should continue to be available for those pupils whose parents desire it.

With the purpose in view of continuing the objects of the Company within the terms of their Charter the Company wish to suggest to you the following alternative arrangement:-

The Company would be willing to grant a Lease of the Mohawk Institute, apart from the Mohawk Chapel, for a nominal rent, for a term of 21 years, your Department being responsible for maintenance and repairs and for the insurance of the property. The Company would retain the freehold of the Chapel and would be responsible for its upkeep.

In the altered circumstances the Company would not propose to maintain their annual grant of £1000 beyond the end of the current year, but they would pay a salary to a Church of England clergyman nominated by the Bishop of the Diocese and appointed by the Company, to give religious instruction in the School and to serve the Chapel. The Company would wish to consider

any scheme for giving small grants to deserving Indian pupils to enable them to continue their education on leaving the school.

The Company hope that these proposals will be acceptable to you and would be much obliged if you would cable giving your views in principle on their suggestions. If you concur generally the Company would then have a draft Lease prepared and sent to you for detailed examination.

I am dealing in a separate letter with the question of the pensions for Miss Hardie and Mr Snell, which was raised in a letter to the Treasurer of the Company from Mr Pnelan.

Dear Mr Phelan,

I have sent a separate letter to your Minister about the general question of the future of the Mohawk Institute.

In this letter I am dealing with the question of the pensions to Miss Hardie and Mr Snell which you raised in your letter to the Treasurer of December 24th 1942.

The Court of the Company have considered the matter in the light of legal advice and a letter from the Charity Commission. They are advised that they are justified in continuing Miss Hardie's pension. They will be willing, therefore, to continue her existing pension of £150 per year for her lifetime.

In regard to Mr Snell, however, the Company are advised that as he was appointed by the Canadian Government without reference to the Company, they would not be entitled to grant any pension to him. I regret, therefore, that it is not possible to concur in this part of your proposal.

I should add that the proposal to pay Miss Hardie's pension is subject to the Department of Mines & Resources accepting the alternative propositions in regard to the future of the Mohawk Institute which I have set out in my letter to your Minister.

The New England Company have considered your letter of the 31st January 1944 addressed to the late Clerk, and also a cable from the Archbishop of Huron despatched on 16th April.

The Company had already embodied the suggestions you make in the draft of a proposed Lease which they sent to the Indian Department in March 1944. In this draft it was proposed that the Indian Department should covenant with the Company that the pupils of the Mohawk Institute whose parents so desired should be trained in the teachings and doctrines of the Church of England in Canada under the supervision of the Chaplain of the Mohawk Chapel. The Company proposed to agree to keep the Chapel of the Institute in good repair and to maintain and pay the salary of a Chaplain to serve the Chapel and to give religious instruction in the Institute, the Chaplain being appointed by the Company on the nomination of the Bishop of the Diocese. It was not proposed to continue the annual grant of £1000. It was proposed that the freehold of the Chapel should be retained unlet by the Company.

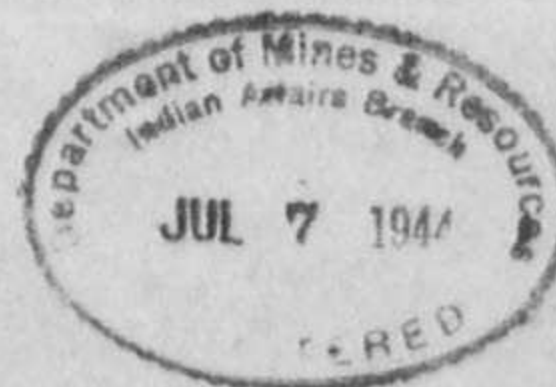
