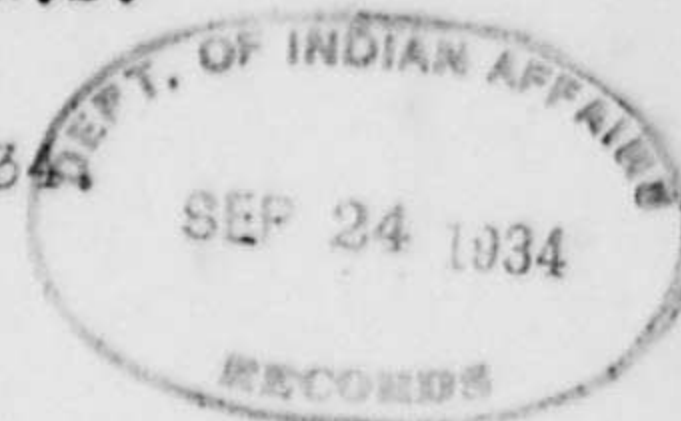

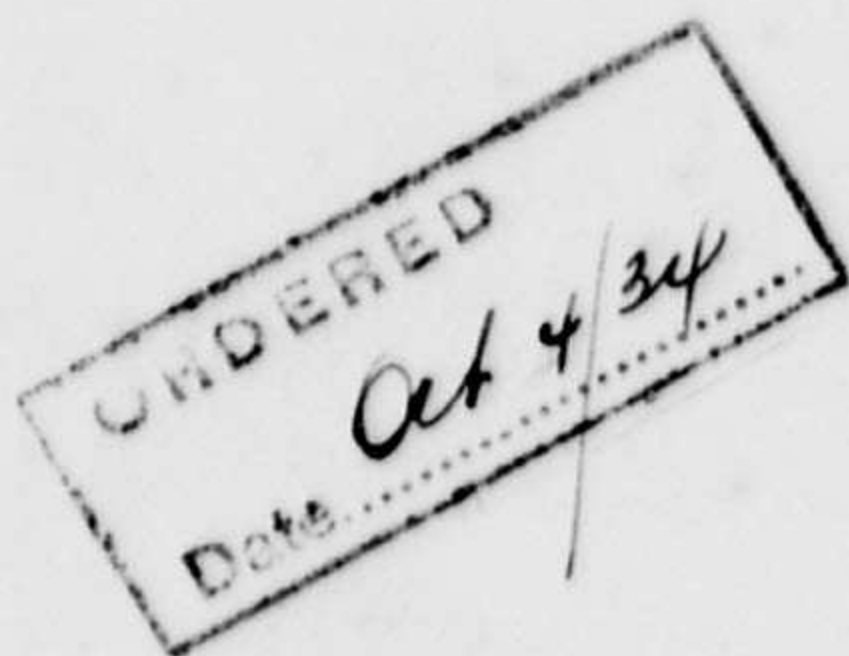

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Ottawa, October 5, 1934.

Reverend Sir:

I have your letter of the 29th ultimo, requesting that dental attention be given a number of the pupils of the Shubenacadie Indian Residential School.

In reply I have to say that you may arrange with K. K. Dimock, D.D.S., Windsor, N. S., to perform the dental work absolutely necessary at the present time for the pupils of the school. The Department would prefer to engage Dr. Dimock for his services on the basis of payment of \$30 per day. A day's work is estimated at 7 hours, during which the dentist is expected to apply himself diligently. He should furnish his own materials but is not required to provide gold fillings or any artificial teeth. Presumably, composition fillings are sufficiently good and no artificial teeth will be required. He should use anaesthetics sufficiently to avoid unnecessary pain.

Funds are available at the present time for not more than three days' dental work for the pupils of this school.

After his visit, Dr. Dimock should prepare an account, in triplicate, for the amount due at the above rate, and hand same to you, to be attached to proper voucher forms, certified and forwarded for payment.

Regarding the scale of payment allowed, I may say it is considered more satisfactory to engage dental services on a per diem basis than at a stated rate for each extraction and filling.

You should arrange to have the required work carried out as soon as possible. This dental work is to be performed at the school, and you can assist by organizing the clinic and seeing that the dentist is kept supplied with patients.

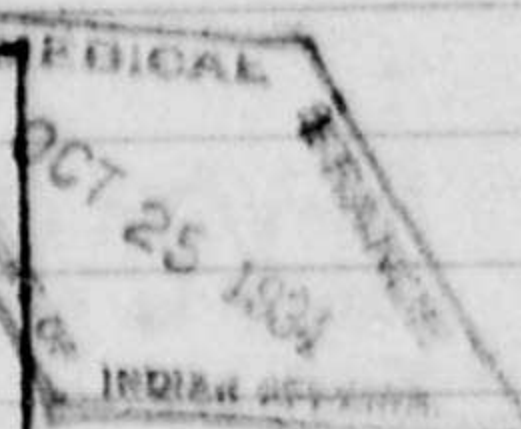
