The Sister in charge of the boys' room is new since my last visit, but I would be inclined to feel that, with more experience, she will make a successful teacher. The grades are arranged as follows:-

The children were all neat, well dressed, and tidy, and the classrooms were well aired, bright and cheerful.

The work in the various departments in the school is in charge of well qualified Sisters, and I found all the work to be well done. A quantity of fancywork and sewing is being made ready for the Regina Exhibition, and will be a credit to the Department.

Fire drill is observed and the children are familiar with the escapes. All equipment is in good repair. Another pressure tank is being installed, which will give a further supply of water in case of fire.

The new boiler room is now completed and is perfectly satisfactory, affording wonderful protection against fire.

A workshop is arranged for upstairs in the building covering the boiler room and root cellar. The boys are kept busy in this building during the cold stormy days of winter learning how to do wood work and to repair shoes and harness.

The Reverend Father has all the work so arranged that the boys do not have a lot of idle time and yet I do not mean that amusements are not also provided. The boys are kept busy during working hours and are made to realize that they are at school for a purpose.

A large number of cattle are stabled and at all times plenty of milk is available for the school.


I found the barns and outbuildings to be clean and in good repair.

Dear Sir:

I enclose herewith Voucher #4975 in favor of the Rev. J. Carriere O.M.I. for the sum of \$59.60 paid for electric fire alarm fixtures installed in the school. No authority was given for this expenditure but as you will note, the account is for fixtures only, all the work of installation being done by the school authorities. There is a complete system of wiring in every part of the school operating from push buttons which ring gongs which are properly distributed through the school. The system is very complete and would be of great assistance in case of fire.

Voucher #4976 in favor of Rev. J. Carriere for the sum of \$53.80, paid for oven repairs is also enclosed. The oven purchased from Jean J. Daoust Limited, some years ago was burnt out and it was impossible to bake bread etc until new asbestos lining was put in and repairs made. It was necessary to have the repairs made without delay and Father Carriere paid for the same and is now asking for a refund of the amount paid.



I enclose and recommend for payment Regina Voucher No. 903 in favor of the Security Lumber Company of Grayson, covering some material procured by the Principal of the Cowessess Boarding school for the purpose of repairs to the lean-to roof of the laundry and the completion of the new hog building. The item of \$12.30 for brick and posts represents a charge against the latter item. In explanation of the other charges, I may say that the leaking of the roof was pointed out to me by the Agent with the request from the Principal to have it remedied. I pointed out that, if the condition ~~is~~ unsatisfactory, it ~~is~~ due to the mistake in the first instance of the Principal of the School who supervized the erection. However, the Principal has forwarded the accounts and asks that payment may be considered, pointing out that the lean-to has been used for over fifteen years and a charge for renewal would not be unreasonable.
